

Bird in a Cage.

The internet is full of pet videos. While cats are the most popular, birds go often unrecognized. But the staging of the relationship between human and bird kind points towards the most fundamental issues – freedom, intimacy, and their perversion. The sound collage contrasts 5 rules for taming birds with frequent interactions among the species.

(bird whistling a march)

female voice 1: First... *(musical clock)* never let your pets go hungry

(bird: Mama!)

male voice 1: Ya, *(clicking tongue)* it is delishes – I know.

male voice 1: Music!

(bird whistling a march)

(parrot: Oh God!)

male voice 1: Ya... Oh God.

male voice 1: Music!

(parrot: Ya)

male voice 1: Ya, turn it.

(musical clock)

(bird)

female voice 2: Mama!

(bird, short break musical clock)

male voice 1: Ya, go on!

(clicking tongue)

female voice 1: Second... *(musical clock)* don't badger your pets...

(bird: meow)

female voice 2: meow

female voice 1: ...and pay attention to their body language.

(bird: whistling, Mama, meow, whistling)

(musical clock stopps)

male voice 1: Go on!

(musical clock)

male voice 1: A peck! Ya, a peck! And again, a peck. Ya, blow me a kiss.

female voice 2: Un bajo, san.

(bird kisses)

male voice 1: Thank you! That's really bad, isn't it, Khallesí?

(parrot: burp)

male voice 1: Ya, did you blow each other a kiss? Will you peck again?
Ya, who is it?

(bird: Mama)

female voice 1: Third... *(male voice 1: Go on!)* respect the cage as safe haven.

(musical clock stopps)

male voice 2: Every cage... *(female voice 2: Mama)* is a captivity.

(bird: Mama)

(musical clock)

female voice 1: Forth... be clear in your communication.

(musical clock stopps)

male voice 1: Good girl! ... Sit!

female voice 2: Ciao!

(bird)

male voice 1: Oh, well done, Khalessi!

(parrot: Oh God!)

male voice 1: Ey, did I not just tell you to...?!

(bird whistling a march)

female voice 1: Fifth... stay patient instead of overstraining your pets
(bird: Mama) on weekends.

(bird clicking tongue)
